Haycock students will use the website without an account during the week of December 4–10 for the Hour of Code. To use the games, courses and tools all year long, students will need to set up a Code.org account. No personal information is needed to create this account.

- 1. Students go to http://code.org/learn.
- 2. Click on the **Log In** link in the top right corner of the window.
- 3. Select **Sign in with Google Account**, and use their fcpsschools.net account.

While Code.org's website is approved for use in FCPS, your permission is still required in order for students under the age of 13 to create an account to use this website.
